

Sermon Guide: Discipleship and Growth | Samuel Voo | Oct 01, 2023

In this sermon, Sam explores the concept of discipleship as the ultimate goal of the Christian life, concluding a three-part series where he has been discussing three of the most important lessons that inform his approach to ministry and life. He emphasizes the importance of discipleship to Jesus, arguing that without it, other aspects of Christian life lose their focus, foundation, and center.

Sam looked at Matthew 28:16-20 in the context of the whole gospel narrative of Matthew, highlighting the special emphasis on discipleship, teaching, and mission in Matthew's gospel. The clear command of Jesus to make disciples is sandwiched, on the one hand, between a confident statement of fact (that all authority has been given to Jesus) and a comforting promise (that he will be with his disciples always).

Sam encourages all of us, whether new believers or old, to continue striving forward in discipleship. One of the beautiful things about a multi-generational church like Granville Chapel, he asserts, is the great potential for opportunities of discipleship to occur between those in different stages of life and Christian maturity. As Granville continues forward in this new season, we encourage everyone to be involved at a variety of levels of involvement: from large gatherings of corporate worship, to smaller groups for fellowship and support, to individual relationships of discipling and being discipled.
